Every Wednesday afternoon at around 4 PM during the school year, over thirty children start arriving at Highland School from schools in the surrounding five counties. About a third of the young musicians are carrying string instruments, which they deposit for tuning in the Art Room across from my Music Room. What follows is my favorite time of the week, the American Children of SCORE rehearsal. A typical SCORE rehearsal starts with group shoulder massages, a vocal warm-up, and announcements. We then spend about 30 minutes singing through our choral parts. For the next 40 minutes or so we split up into sectional rehearsals. The strings players go to the Art Room for a rehearsal with the Strings Director, Cynthia Saucedo Estrada. Betsy Porter often takes the younger children to a room down the hall to work

on soprano recorder parts. I usually stay in the main room with a large group of older children and work on Orff instrument parts. In the weeks approaching a public concert, we all come back together for the last 15 or 20 minutes of rehearsals to put together the musical alchemy of our SCORE arrangements. When parents arrive at 5:45 to pick up their charges, they can get an earful of raw ensemble music being assembled. These are the most exciting, musical moments!

We love hearing from families who have been touched by SCORE.
